2011 Malvasia Bianca, San Bernabe Vineyard, Monterey

Malvasia Bianca is one of the oldest cultivated aromatic grape varieties. This full-bodied, dry white wine has tropical floral aromas yet is refreshingly dry. Believed to be of Greek origin, it is cultivated throughout the Mediterranean basin as well as the Iberian Peninsula. ***Gold Medal and Best Class White Varietals***



2011 Albariño, Riverbench Vineyard, Santa Maria Valley

Traditionally grown in Spain and Portugal, this is the first grown and produced bottling of Iberia's iconic white grape from the Santa Maria Valley. This wine shows floral aromas with bright acidity and flavors of peach, nectarine and citrus fruits.



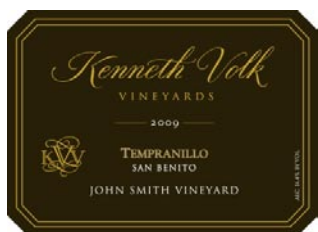
2009 Mourvèdre, Enz Vineyard, Lime Kiln Valley

The Enz vineyard Mourvèdre is the oldest plantings on the Central Coast. In its 87th growing season, these ancient, head-trained, dry-farmed vines produced a beautiful, well balanced crop of small-berried clusters. Ripe fruit aromas and exotic spice are followed by flavors of plum, cherry and licorice.



2009 Tempranillo, Bella Collina Vineyard, Paso Robles

Sourced from the Bella Collina Vineyard located on the west side of Paso Robles, the calcareous soils and attentive viticulture contribute to the delicious flavors and aromas of this wine. The resulting wine shows bright red fruit aromas of candied cherry and blackberry. Flavors of raspberry and black cherry are supplemented by complex spice with hints of tobacco and cedar.



2009 Tempranillo, John Smith Vineyard, San Benito

Tempranillo is the principal variety of Spain's quintessential red wine, Rioja. The fruit from this bottling came from the John Smith Vineyard, in the cool San Juan Valley, near the town of Hollister. Traditional wine-making techniques of open top fermentation and aging in French oak helped to craft this delicious wine
